

Registration and Accreditation

Requirements and Recommendations

Overview

This document lists the requirements of our members and member Associations in regard to registration, and some further recommendations in regard to competition management and accreditation.

These standards are being put in place to provide consistency and certainty, to help improve education and reporting standards and to reduce organisational risk.

Netball Tasmania will work with member Associations to help implement these.

Requirements

This section lists requirements of participants in Netball Tasmania sanctioned competitions in order to be covered by Netball Tasmania's group insurance policy (both liability and personal accident) for incidents occurring at or in relation to said competitions.

Recommendations

This section lists practices or standards that are recommended to be adopted by Associations, either as part of their bylaws or at least in practice.

Notes:

- 1. Participants registering for multiple roles for the same period will only be charged the highest rate. For example, a participant who registers as a Player for a season and then also as a Coach will not be charged for the second registration. If they register as a Coach first and then a Player, they will only be charged the difference on the second registration.
- 2. For school or social teams, the role of coach may be closer to that of a team manager. In these cases, registering with the Team Manager role (free of charge) would be appropriate.
- 3. While committee members perform a role across the whole Club or Association, the only mechanism for registration is through a competition and season. It is recommended that all committee members register for whichever is seen as the main competition and season for the Club or Association in a given year.
- 4. The requirements for umpires refers to those regularly performing that role, as opposed to those allocated on a temporary basis, filling in, or umpiring a game or two to begin their journey.
