

Netball Tasmania Annual Grants

Development Coaching Accreditation Grant



The purpose of this grant is to allow individuals the ability to apply for financial assistance for their personal development as a coach by undertaking the Development coaching course.

6.1 CRITERIA

- Applicants must be a current Netball Tasmania registered member and have already completed their Foundation coaching accreditation
- Applicants must be able to complete the online component of the Development accreditation by December 31 2025
- Have a current Registration to Work with Vulnerable Persons

6.2 PROCESS FOR GRANT APPLICATION

- Netball Tasmania will distribute a dedicated online form through which individuals can apply
- All details on the nomination form must be completed
- Nominations must be submitted to Netball Tasmania by the closing date as advertised each year

6.3 SELECTION OF GRANT RECIPIENTS

- A Netball Tasmania panel will be responsible for selecting the recipients of the grant
- There is no set number of grants available, as the number of individuals that may apply is highly variable, however, the total maximum value of the coaching grants available per annum is \$500
- It is at the discretion of Netball Tasmania as to how many grants are issued and their dollar value in any given year
- The panel's decisions are final; no correspondence will be entered into

6.4 ENTITLEMENTS

- Grant recipients must undertake the online component of the Development coaching course prior to December 31st 2025. Once this component has been completed, and the receipt of payment sent to finance@tasnetball.org.au, grant recipients will then receive a reimbursement from Netball Tasmania to cover the cost of the online component of the course.

6.5 ACQUITTAL

- Successful grant applicants must also share/promote via their clubs social media channels how the grant was used

6.6 CONDITIONS

- Should a successful grant applicant fail to undertake the Development course by the specified date the grant becomes null and void.
